When moving into a new home, it's important to determine what the radon levels are early on.



If you are going to renovate after purchasing, you should test for radon after all renovations are completed.



High radon is EASILY FIXABLE, and is not a reason to be put off buying a new home.



Radon-mitigated properties will have very low radon and are the healthiest homes you can buy.



Key Facts

- 1 in 5 single family residential properties are above 200 Bq/m³
- All properties are unique; the only way to know the radon level is to test
- Radon-mitigated homes have the healthiest air possible



Short term tests are generally unreliable and may give a false high or low reading.

C-NRPP

When reducing radon, use the services of a radon mitigation professional with an active C-NRPP certification.



Only long term radon tests performed for three or more months (91+ days) are reliable.



If you are purchasing to rent out, some provinces* have legal obligations to ensure low radon levels to protect tenant health.
