Equally informed buyers and sellers means a healthy real estate transaction.



Testing for or finding high radon is unlikely to sour a home sale (as it is so easily fixable).



In some Canadian provinces*, landlords must ensure rentals have low radon - this is the law.

Homes built using the 2010 Canadian building code have radon mitigation rough-ins, but these are not active.



Key Facts

- 1 in 5 single family residential properties are above 200 Bq/m³
- All properties are unique; the only way to know the radon level is to test
- Radon-mitigated homes have the healthiest air possible



Radon mitigation is effective, quick and is a selling point, as those homes have the lowest achievable radon levels.

C-NRPP

When reducing radon, use the services of a radon mitigation professional with an active C-NRPP certification.



Ideally, sellers should radon test for 91+ days before selling the home.



Not all radon test devices are equal, some can be tampered with and short-term testing is generally unreliable.
