Residential radon levels in Canada are among the highest in the world. Every home has the potential to contain high cancer-causing amount of radon.



The 2025 National Building Code of Canada has introduced the requirement for a full radon mitigation system in newly built homes.



A passive radon stack is a vertical pipe that extends from beneath a home's foundation through to the homes exterior, creating a pathway to help vent radon gas.



During construction, home builders can decide whether they want a passive stack, or an active side-wall system.



Key Facts

- 1 in 5 residential properties are above 200 Bq/m³
- All properties are unique; the only way to know the radon level is to test
- Radon-mitigated homes have the healthiest air possible



A radon mitigation system will help to reduce the radon levels in the home by more than 80%.



Homes that have been mitigated for radon have much healthier indoor air, which is often a great selling point to potential buyers.



Providing a full radon mitigation system costs less during the construction phase than retrofitting a home later.



Builders can set the standard and distinguish themselves from others by offering full radon mitigation systems in their newly built homes.
